Research interests

My main line of research focuses on an extreme form of prejudice, i.e., dehumanization and its different forms. In this regard, I am now studying the process of objectification in the work domain, by focusing both on the antecedents and consequences of this phenomenon.

A second line of research centers around intergroup relations. In particular, I am investigating prejudice and intergroup misunderstandings by adopting both a majority and minority perspective. In this regard, I am also interested in the role of intergroup contact as means for ameliorating intergroup relations both in conflictual and non-conflictual contexts.

A third line of research focuses on the real-life consequences of violent video-games exposure. In particular, I am exploring the consequences of this exposure in relation with the process of moral disengagement.

I published the findings of my research on relevant journals, such as PlosOne, Social Personality and Psychological Science, European Journal of Social Psychology, British Journal of Social Psychology or Group Processes and Intergroup Relations. Further, I presented the findings of his research in relevant international conferences, such as the SPPSI/EASP 2014 Joint Meeting "The Great Recession and Social Class Divides" (Princeton University, US) or the 16th EASP General Meeting (Stockholm, Sweden). I also chaired scientific symposia in the most important social psychology conferences, including the 17th EASP general Meeting (Granada, Spain) and the 2018 SPSP annual Convention (Atlanta, US). I have been invited speaker in prestigious universities, such as Guildford University (UK) or Geneva University (Switzerland). Finally, some of our research findings received large international attention by media, such as Time Magazine, Pacific Standard or Le Figarò.

Editorial activity

I am Editorial Board Member for the Journal of Community and Applied Social Psychology. I was Editor In-Chief of In-Mind Italia (ISSN: 2240-2454). I

am now Associate Editor for the same journal. I am also reviewer ad hoc of relevant international journals, such as PlosOne, European Journal of Social Psychology, British Journal of Social Psychology, Social Psychological and Personality Science and many others.
